Since March of last year, representatives of the parishes of Greece/Charlotte/Hilton have been meeting on a regular basis. We call this the Greece/Charlotte/Hilton Pastoral Planning Task Force. The parishes are: Holy Cross in Charlotte, Our Mother of Sorrows, St. Lawrence, St. Mark, St. John the Evangelist on Ridge

Road, St. Charles Borromeo, and St. Leo in Hilton. What is the work of this task force? The work of the task force is to come together and, in light of the facts

of a fewer number of priests, less financial resources, and fewer active parishioners—how can the parishes best meet the needs of the Catholic community in this area.

The task force began when I approached our bishop after a Priests' Council meeting in 2021. A presentation regarding pastoral planning in northern Cayuga County had been given. I was impressed with the presentation and mentioned to the bishop that I thought it might be a good idea for the parishes in this area of Monroe County to begin that conversation. As you know, I serve the diocese not only as a pastor of this parish but At St. Lawrence Church, three ways in which we have as a Dean of the Monroe West Deanery, assisting the bishop in this area of our diocese. I mentioned my idea to Fr. Bill Coffas who is the pastor of Our Mother of Sorrows and Holy Cross as well as Dean of the Monroe Central Deanery. We agreed to gather the pastors of Greece together to see if this kind of conversation was worthwhile. We gathered and agreed to form this task force. After that initial meeting of the pastors, before the task force gathered, St. Leo's in Hilton was brought into this group. Each parish has two representatives chosen by the pastoral leader and the pastoral leader

himself. Our first meeting took place in March 2022.

We have gathered a great deal of data, most of which has been shared in our church bulletins. We have also shared some reflections on the ministries of each parish, some unique ministries, and why this conversation is important.

Out of this group have come some subgroups to share and reflect upon the topics of evangelization, vocations to church ministry, and communicating effectively to our parish communities.

We cannot ignore the fact that the number of our diocesan priests is going down and the average age of our priests is going up. We cannot ignore the fact that the number of people actively attending our churches has gone down over the last 10 to 20 years and in all of our parishes in the northeastern United States. These two realities pose challenges for all of us and we need to prepare for our futures.

already prepared is in the sharing with other parishes in the area our financial division. Our Finance Director, Business Manager, and Bookkeeper all work not only for us but six other churches. Our Faith Formation Ministry is also regional. Four churches in our area share that staff. And our Youth Ministry is now paired with St. Charles Borromeo Church. This is the beginning of what can only be entitled "more to come." Please pray for this effort and that God will continue to guide us. And know, that our concern is to serve as best we can the Catholic community in our area.


